Resilience

Help your child to identify and name their own feelings — happy, frustrated, jealous, angry, scared.

Let go of being perfect. Let your child see you make mistakes!

Show your child how to ask for help.....make them see it's okay to need help.

Help your child to learn to wait — play waiting games like traffic lights, make them wait the duration of a sand timer before they can watch the TV or go outside. Praise them for waiting.

Role model that there are different ways to do things and help children to think of these too.

Independence

Encourage your child to dress themselves and do zips and shoes. Can they manage clothes that are inside out?



Give your child little jobs to increase their self-worth.

Create situations where your child has to ask other people for help, not just you.

Help children learn to look after their own things, carry their own things and know where they are. Help them to follow instructions by saying their name first, waiting for them to look at you and then give the instruction.

Ask them to repeat it back so they know there is an expectation to listen.

Perseverance

Engineer situations where your child has to continue at an activity without you......

- Jigsaws "I'll be back in 3 minutes you see if you can find the piece that goes there".
- Sorting "see if you can find all the wiggly pasta and put them in a line. I'll be back to see in 3 minutes"



Make the activity suitably challenging but achievable. Set a clear end and don't change the goal posts.

Try to help children create and fulfil their own goals.
This way they become intrinsically motivated to learn rather than extrinsically motivated by rewards.

Check on your child's progress and praise perseverance "well done, you are still looking for that Jigsaw piece, I like how you're not giving up".

Praise the effort and the process not the outcome.


